Electronic application service



This service allows you to complete some Shinjuku City procedures online from your home or workplace.

You can easily pay your resident's tax and light motor vehicle tax via your smartphone or computer.

Mobile Regi

Scan the barcode on payment slips with your smartphone to pay via online banking or credit card.

Electronic money

Scan the barcode on payment slips with your smartphone to pay using electronic money from your charge balance.

Pay-easy

Enter the number listed on a Payeasy-compatible payment slip via online banking or at an ATM to pay.

Emergency Calls <119 & <110



What you are asked when you call 119

- Fire or ambulance?
- In case of illness or injury: "ambulance".
- Tell us the address of where you are.
- What do you see nearby?
- What happened?
- Tell us your name.

You can use your native tongue.



ODo not hang up the phone. Stand by.

English, Mandarin Chinese, Korean, Portuguese, and Spanish are available 24 hours a day. Other languages are available occasionally.

Fire

If you witness a fire, tell people around you immediately. Then call 119.



When there is a fire extinguisher nearby, use it to put out the fire. If the flames reach the ceiling, stop and flee the scene.





Pull the safety pin. Point the nozzle toward the base of the fire.

Squeeze the lever.

Point the nozzle toward a burning object, not the blaze. Stand 3 to 5m from the flames.

In the event of an earthquake, protect your Earthquake In the event of an earthquake, protect you head and body. And, stay in a safe place.



Furniture may fall over, or things may fall. Protect your head and body by getting under a table or covering yourself with a cushion.



Do not rush outside. Things might fall.



Window glass, signboards, etc. may fall. Protect your head with a bag or clothing.
